

A Troubled Economy

Local 295 Goes To Bat For Members

The Employee Free Choice Act

If we can get the Employee Free Choice Act (EFCA), passed and signed into law, these 60 million will have a better shot at joining a union and bargaining for better wages, benefits and working conditions.

And the more workers who are organized, the stronger we will all be. The Act, if passed, will:

- Establish stronger penalties for violation of employee rights to organize and collectively bargain.
- Allow employees to form unions by signing cards authorizing union representation.

Get Out To Vote!

The President, Congress and State officials that we elect in this November's election will decide the fate of EFCA and other aspects of our future, including affordable health care, Social Security, education and energy policies.

We know the power that we as a local-TOGETHER-wield. Local 295 is number one in the country when it comes to the amount of money per member contributed to Teamsters' DRIVE political action fund.

Our new goal is to be first in the number of members registered to vote. That's why we're conducting a Local 295 voter registeration campaign. If you are not registered to vote, I urge you to do so now. If you are registered but not at your current address you need to register using your new address.

NOTICE OF NOMINATION MEETING AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS Proper identification is required to be admitted to the meeting

A Special Membership Meeting of Local 295 will be held for the purpose of nominating candidates for the President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, Recording Secretary and three (3) Trustees of Local 295 IBT. The terms of office for these officers will begin on January 1, 2009 and end on December 31, 2011.

The meeting will be held on:

Nominations must be made and seconded at the Nomination Meeting by a member in good standing other than the nominee. A member unable to attend may nominate or second a nomination in writing A member must accept his/her nomination at the meeting or, if unable to attend, in writing. Any such written nominations, seconds and acceptances must be received by the Secretary-Treasurer by 4:00 PM on Friday August 29, 2008 by mail c/o Local 295 IBT, 33 West Hawthorne Avenue, Valley Stream, NY 11580 or hand delivered by 6:00 PM on September 2, 2008, before the start of the Nominations Meeting. No member may accept nomination for more than one position. To nominate or second a candidate or otherwise participate in the nomination meeting, a member must have his/her dues paid up through the month of August 2008 and must be an active member on the day of the nomination meeting. Prospective candidates are advised to verify eligibility with the Secretary-Treasurer, in advance of the nomination meeting. Although a potential candidate must verify his/her eligibility with the Secretary-Treasurer directly, a computer run will be available at the nominations meeting for prospective candidates to verify the eligibility of his/her nominators and seconders. A meeting for all candidates will take place immediately following nominations with the representative from Election Services Solutions.

To be eligible to be elected for any office in Local 295, a member must be in continuous good standing in Local 295 and actively employed in a craft within the jurisdiction of Local 295 for a period of 24 consecutive months prior to September 2008 and must be eligible to hold office if elected. This requirement includes the timely payment of dues for the 24-month period, together with no interruption in active membership in Local 295 because of suspension, expulsions, withdrawals, transfers or failure to pay fines or assessments. Prospective nominees are advised to verify their eligibility with the Secretary-Treasurer in advance of the nomination meeting. Candidates shall have the right to campaign and appear on the ballot as members of a slate.

A member on dues check off will not lose good standing as a result of a delay or default in the employer's transmittal of dues to the Local Union or because of an employer's failure to make the proper deductions in any month in which the member has earnings from which deductions could have been made

This election shall be held in accordance with the Local 295 Bylaws, and the IBT International Constitution. Elected officers of Local 295 shall, by virtue of such election, be delegates to any Joint Council with which Local 295 is affiliated.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Election for officers of Local 295 shall be by a secret ballot, conducted by mail referendum. The printing, mailing, receiving and tabulating of all ballots shall be conducted by Election Services Solutions. In order to vote in the election, a member must be in good standing and have paid his/her dues through September 2008. Members may pay all dues arrearages, initiation or reinstatement fees, at the Local 295 office until 12 Noon on Tuesday, October 14, 2008.

Ballots will be mailed to each active member of Local 295, at that member's last known address, on or about September 23, 2008. Returned voted ballots from members of Local 295 must be received by Election Services Solutions no later than 9:00 AM on Wednesday, October 15, 2008, in order to be counted in this election.

Members who do not receive a ballot in the mail by September 29, 2008, may request a replacement ballot be sent to them. If more than one ballot is received from a member, the ballot marked duplicate will be accepted. Members can telephone Election Services Solutions at 1 800 864 1263 up until October 10, 2008 to request a duplicate ballot. Member must call personally and will receive a confirmation number.

Get A Withdrawal Card When You Leave Your Job

Be sure to request a withdrawal card within 90 days from when you are laid off, called to active duty, terminated, retire, go on disability or leave the craft. The charge for the withdrawal card is \$0.50. All initiation fees and back dues must be up to date before the withdrawal card is issued. Mail or bring in the form below to the Local 295 office along with your check or money order for \$0.50. It is your responsibility to obtain a withdrawal card. Failure to obtain a withdrawal card might obligate you to pay extra dues and re-initiation fees.
