

Get a Withdrawal Card When You Leave Your Job

Do not forget to file for a Withdrawal Card within 90 days from when you are Laid Off, called to Military Duty, Terminated, Resign, Retire, go on Disability or leave the craft. The charge for the withdrawal card is \$0.50. All initiation fees and dues must be up to date before the withdrawal card is issued. It is your responsibility to obtain a withdrawal card.
Failure to obtain a withdrawal card might obligate you to pay extra dues and re-initiation fees.
